Relationships Australia WA is committed to the safety and wellbeing of children and young people, by providing child-friendly environments where they feel safe and are safe. Relationships Australia WA ensures children and young people are listened to, and their voices are heard regarding decisions affecting their lives.

RAWA is committed to creating a child-safe organisational culture, comprehensive screening and responding to and managing situational risks, through;

- Treating children and young people as individuals with rights
- Ensuring disclosure will be treated seriously and acted upon
- Ensuring all RAWA staff are empowered and confident to raise concerns
- Not tolerating any inappropriate behavior
- Monitoring environments
- Training staff in recognising and responding to all forms of child abuse including grooming

RAWA is committed to ensuring the cultural safety of children and young people from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, those with a disability and those who identify as LGBTQIA+.

All RAWA staff have a responsibility to understand the role they play to ensure that the safety and wellbeing of children and young people.

RAWA recognises the devastating impacts and effects of child abuse and is committed to preventing and identifying and addressing risks to children and young people.
